

What is AVID Weekly?

- A curriculum tool to help teach critical reading skills
- Based on critical reading strategies developed by AVID Center
- Uses current newspaper articles to provide students with high-interest stories while exposing them to various writing styles
 - Articles are rated for level of difficulty: Foundational, Intermediate, and Advanced.
 - Articles are designated by the content area that is the focus of each article.

Who uses AVID Weekly?

- Middle level and high school AVID Elective teachers
- Content area teachers where critical reading is important

How is AVID Weekly accessed?

- AVID Weekly is internet-delivered and accessible to teachers 24 hours per day, 7 days per week.
- Teachers set up a username and password to gain access to new articles and sample lessons (monthly) and archives of previous articles/lessons.

What does a school receive with a one-year subscription to AVID Weekly?

- Up to 20 usernames/passwords for teachers and administrators from subscribing school to access the articles and lessons at any time
- 15 new articles available for viewing and/or download on the first of each month from September through June (also includes additional articles/lessons from June, 2011)
- A sample lesson both in full length and summary versions is provided each month in conjunction with three of that month's articles
- A viewable and printable grid each month with listings of the articles and lessons for that month
- Access via archives on AVID Weekly website to all grids, articles, lessons, and critical reading strategies posted during the current school year

What does it cost?

- A school-year subscription (10 months – September through June) costs \$515 per school.
